



The Frankston Hospital redevelopment design recognises the unique character of Frankston and the Mornington Peninsula. Through the use of colour, material and texture, the design draws inspiration from the region's:

- shell middens and fossils

- wetlands, swamps and marshes, including the Carrum Carrum wetlands
